



Gruskin fountain dedicated in New London

Attorney Samuel Gruskin spoke Saturday at the dedication of a 15-foot-tall bronze sculpture presented to the Public Library of New London in memory of his brother, the late Isser Gruskin, an attorney and prominent city resident. William McCloy, professor emeritus at Connecticut College who did the

sculpture, and Mildred Gruskin, wife of the late attorney, are at left. The sculpture is near the library's Huntington Street entrance. Mrs. Gruskin spoke about the influence libraries on her husband as an immigrant boy. McCloy said the sculpture's theme reflects New London's history.
